Introduction

This hearing dealt with an Application for Dispute Resolution by the Landlord to obtain an Order of Possession for unpaid rent, and a Monetary Order for unpaid rent and to recover the cost of the filing fee from the Tenants for this application.

Issue(s) to be Decided

- 1. Have the Tenants breached the Residential Tenancy Act?
- 2. If so, has the Landlord proven entitlement to an Order of Possession and a Monetary Order as a result of that breach?

Background and Evidence

The Landlord appeared and advised the parties have resolved the matter, the Tenants have paid their rent in full, and the tenancy has been reinstated.

Analysis Analysis

As the parties have resolved the matter, no further action is required. I decline to award the filing fee to the Landlord as the matter has been resolved.

Conclusion

The tenancy has been reinstated, therefore no further action is required and the file is now closed.
