DECISION

Introduction

This hearing dealt with an application by a former owner of the residential property for a monetary order, an order of possession, an order allowing him access to the rental unit and an order authorizing him to change the locks. Both parties participated in the conference call hearing.

Issue to be Decided

Does this issue fall within the jurisdiction of the Residential Tenancy Act?

Background and Evidence

The facts are not in dispute. The applicant formerly owned the property, which was sold by order by the Supreme Court on January 19, 2012. The applicant acknowledged that the new owners had never at any time given him permission to occupy the residential property.

<u>Analysis</u>

As the parties have not entered into a tenancy agreement and the applicant acknowledged that he did not have a license to occupy the premises, I find that the applicant was not a tenant under the Act and accordingly I dismiss the application for lack of jurisdiction.

Conclusion

The claim is dismissed.
