RECORD OF SETTLEMENT

<u>Dispute Codes</u> MNDC, MNSD

Section 63 of the *Residential Tenancy Act* provides that the parties may attempt to settle their dispute during a hearing. Pursuant to this provision, discussion between the parties during the hearing led to a resolution. Specifically, it was agreed as follows;

1. Both parties agree that the landlord will return \$875.00 from the security and pet deposit to the tenants. That payment is to be made by cheque, certified cheque or money order by September 30, 2012.

The above particulars comprise <u>full and final settlement</u> of all aspects of the dispute arising from this application for both parties.

Pursuant to this agreement the tenants will be given a monetary order to reflect condition #1 of this agreement. Should it be necessary, this order may be filed in the Small Claims Division of the Provincial Court and enforced as an order of that Court.

This decision is made on authority delegated to me by the Director of the Residential Tenancy Branch under Section 9.1(1) of the Residential Tenancy Act.
