DECISION

Introduction

This hearing dealt with an Application for Dispute Resolution by the tenant under the *Residential Tenancy Act* (the “Act”) to cancel a notice to end tenancy due to tenant’s employment with landlord ending, to cancel a notice to end tenancy for unpaid rent or utilities, and “other”, although details regarding the “other” portion of the application were not provided.

No one was in attendance for either the applicant tenant or the respondent landlords.

Issues to be Decided

- Should the notices to end tenancy be cancelled?

Background and Evidence

There was no additional evidence or testimony provided as there was no one in attendance at the scheduled hearing.

Analysis

Section 61 of the *Residential Tenancy Act* states that upon accepting an application for dispute resolution, the Director must set the matter down for a hearing and that the Director must determine if the hearing is to be oral or in writing. In this case, the hearing was scheduled for an oral teleconference hearing.

Rule 10.1 of the Rules of Procedure provides as follows:

10.1 Commencement of the dispute resolution proceeding

The dispute resolution proceeding must commence at the scheduled time unless otherwise decided by the Dispute Resolution Officer. The Dispute Resolution Officer may conduct the dispute resolution proceeding in the absence of a party and may make a decision or dismiss the application, with or without leave to reapply.

In the absence of the applicant tenant and respondent landlords, the telephone line remained open while the phone system was monitored for ten minutes and no one on

behalf of the applicant tenant or respondent landlords called into the hearing during this time. Based on the aforementioned I find that the tenant has not presented the merits of his application and his application is hereby dismissed with leave to reapply.

Conclusion

I HEREBY DISMISS the tenant's application, with leave to reapply.

I note this does not extend any applicable time limits under the *Act*.

This decision is final and binding on the parties, unless otherwise provided under the Act, and is made on authority delegated to me by the Director of the Residential Tenancy Branch under Section 9.1(1) of the *Residential Tenancy Act*.
