RECORD OF SETTLEMENT

Dispute Codes OPL, MNR, FF

Section 63 of the *Residential Tenancy Act* provides that the parties may attempt to settle their dispute during a hearing. Pursuant to this provision, discussion between the parties during the hearing led to a resolution. Specifically, it was agreed as follows;

- 1. Both parties agree that the landlord will be given an order of possession that will take effect at 1:00 p.m. on Friday January 9, 2015.
- 2. Both parties agree that the tenant will return all the keys of the subject unit to the landlords' agents by 12:00 p.m. on Friday January 9, 2015.

Pursuant to this agreement the landlord will be given an order of possession to reflect condition #1 of this agreement. Should it be necessary, this order may be filed in the Supreme Court and enforced as an order of that Court.

As both parties have benefited from this settlement I decline to make a finding in regards to the filing fee.

The above particulars comprise <u>full and final settlement</u> of all aspects of the dispute arising from this application for both parties.

This decision is made on authority delegated to me by the Director of the Residential Tenancy Branch under Section 9.1(1) of the *Residential Tenancy Act*.
