### **DECISION**

#### <u>Introduction</u>

This hearing dealt with an application by the landlord for a monetary order for unpaid rent, cost of repairs and the filing fee. The landlord stated that the tenant moved out sometime in August 2014, without notice and did not provide a forwarding address. The landlord served the tenant with a notice of hearing package, by registered mail. However, since the landlord did not have a forwarding address for the tenant, he served it to the mailing address that the tenant had provided at the start of tenancy. The package was returned to the landlord and the tenant did not attend the hearing.

#### <u>Issue to be Decided</u>

Was the tenant served with the notice of hearing pursuant to Section 88?

## <u>Analysis</u>

Section 88 of the *Residential Tenancy Act* addresses how to give or serve documents. The purpose of serving a notice of hearing under the Legislation is to notify the person being served of matters relating to arbitration. The tenant is entitled to have an opportunity to be heard at the hearing. Based on the testimony of the landlord, I am not satisfied that the notice of hearing was served in accordance with section 88 of the *Act*.

#### Conclusion

The landlord's application is dismissed with leave to reapply.
