RECORD OF SETTLEMENT

<u>Dispute Codes</u> OPR, MNR, FF, CNR, OLC, FF

Section 63 of the *Residential Tenancy Act* provides that the parties may attempt to settle their dispute during a hearing. Pursuant to this provision, discussion between the parties during the hearing led to a resolution. Specifically, it was agreed as follows;

- 1. Both parties agree tenant will move out by no later than 1:00 p.m. on May 31, 2015.
- 2. Both parties agree that the tenants are not required to pay any rent for the month of May 2015.

Pursuant to this agreement the landlord will be given an order of possession to reflect condition #1 of this agreement. Should it be necessary, this order may be filed in the Supreme Court and enforced as an order of that Court.

As both parties have benefited from this arrangement I decline to make a finding in regards to the filing fee and each party must bear that cost.

The above particulars comprise <u>full and final settlement</u> of all aspects of the dispute arising from this application for both parties.

This decision is made on authority delegated to me by the Director of the Residential Tenancy Branch under Section 9.1(1) of the *Residential Tenancy Act*.
