## DECISION

### Introduction

This hearing was set for a telephone conference call at 9:00 a.m., in response to an Application for Dispute Resolution (the “Application”) made by the Tenant for: money owed or compensation for damage or loss under the *Residential Tenancy Act* (the “Act”), regulation or tenancy agreement; the Landlord to comply with the Act, regulation or tenancy agreement; and to recover the filing fee from the Landlord. The line remained open while the phone system was monitored for ten minutes and the only participant who called into the hearing was legal counsel for the Landlord.

### Analysis & Conclusion

Rule 10.1 of the Dispute Resolution Proceedings Rules of Procedure states that the hearing must commence at the scheduled time unless otherwise decided by the Arbitrator. The Arbitrator may conduct the hearing in the absence of a party and may make a decision or dismiss the Application, with or without leave to re-apply.

As the Tenant did not appear by 9:10 a.m., and the Landlord’s legal counsel appeared and was ready to proceed, I dismiss the Tenant’s’ Application **without** leave to reapply.

This decision is made on authority delegated to me by the Director of the Residential Tenancy Branch under Section 9.1(1) of the *Residential Tenancy Act*.
