DECISION

<u>Introduction</u>

This matter was set for hearing by telephone conference call at 11:00 a.m., in response to an Application for Dispute Resolution (the "Application") made by the Landlord for an Order of Possession. The telephone line remained open while the phone system was monitored for ten minutes and no participant called into the hearing during this time.

Analysis & Conclusion

The Residential Tenancy Branch Rules of Procedure state that the hearing must commence at the scheduled time unless otherwise decided by the Arbitrator. The Arbitrator may conduct the hearing in the absence of a party and may make a decision or dismiss the Application, with or without leave to re-apply.

As neither party called into the conference call by 11:10 a.m., I find the Landlord has not presented the merits of this Application which is hereby dismissed with leave to reapply. However, this does not extend any applicable time limits under the *Residential Tenancy Act* and I have made no findings of fact or law with respect to the merits of this Application.
