DECISION

<u>Introduction</u>

This hearing dealt with an Application for Dispute Resolution by the Landlord for an Order of Possession based on unpaid rent.

The Landlord previously applied for an Order of Possession by way of Direct Proceeding pursuant to section 55(4) of the *Residential Tenancy Act.* That application was adjourned to a participatory hearing scheduled to occur on today's date at 9:30 a.m. The line remained open while the phone system was monitored for ten minutes and no participant called into the hearing during this time.

Analysis and Conclusion

As the Applicant Landlord did not attend the hearing by 9:40, I dismiss their claim with leave to reapply. I note this does not extend any applicable time limits under the Act.

This decision is final and binding on the parties, except as otherwise provided under the Act, and is made on authority delegated to me by the Director of the Residential Tenancy Branch under Section 9.1(1) of the Residential Tenancy Act.
