DECISION

<u>Introduction</u>

The Application for Dispute Resolution filed by the Tenant seeks an order that the landlord comply with the Act, Regulations and/or tenancy agreement. The details in the Application for Dispute Resolution state she is applying for compensation as she does not believe the landlord intends to use the rental unit for his grandmother.

I waited 10 minutes to enable them to call in and participate in this hearing. I checked that the hearing was scheduled for 9:00 a.m. on July 16, 2018. I confirmed that the correct call-in numbers and participant codes had been provided in the Notice of Hearing. I called in a second time. In both cases the teleconference system confirmed that I was the only person who had called into this teleconference.

I then concluded the hearing and closed the conference call.

As neither party has appeared for the hearing I order the application dismissed with liberty to reapply. I make no findings on the merits of the matter. Liberty to reapply is not an extension of any applicable limitation period.

This decision is made on authority delegated to me by the Director of the Residential Tenancy Branch under section 9.1(1) of the Residential Tenancy Act.
