DECISION

<u>Introduction</u>

This hearing was convened by way of conference call in response to an Application for Dispute Resolution filed by the Tenants on June 11, 2018 (the "Application"). The Tenants applied for the return of the security deposit and pet damage deposit. The Tenants also sought reimbursement for the filing fee.

Neither party attended at the appointed time set for the hearing on August 31, 2018. I waited 11 minutes, until 1:41 p.m., to enable the parties to participate in this hearing scheduled for 1:30 p.m. I confirmed from the teleconference system that I was the only person who had called into this teleconference. I confirmed the correct call-in numbers and participant code had been provided in the Notice of Hearing.

Given neither party attended the hearing, I dismiss the Application with leave to re-apply. However, this does not extend any time limits set out in the *Residential Tenancy Act* (the "*Act*").

Conclusion

The Application is dismissed with leave to re-apply. This does not extend any time limits set out in the *Act*.
