DECISION

Introduction

The tenant filed an Application for Dispute Resolution on November 21, 2019 seeking an order that the landlord cancel or withdraw the 10-Day Notice to End Tenancy (the "Notice"). The tenant also made a request for an order allowing more time to complete the Application in this matter. The matter proceeded by way of a hearing pursuant to section 74(2) of the *Residential Tenancy Act* (the "Act") on January 17, 2020.

Neither the tenant nor the landlord attended the hearing, although I left the teleconference hearing connection open until 11:10 a.m. to enable the parties to call in to this teleconference hearing scheduled for 11:00 a.m.

I confirmed that the correct call-in numbers and participant codes had been provided in the Notice of Hearing. I also confirmed throughout the duration of the call that neither party was in attendance.

Rule 7.3 of the Rules of Procedure provides that if a party or their agent fails to attend the hearing, the arbitrator may conduct the hearing in the absence of that party or dismiss the application without leave to re-apply.

Issue(s) to be Decided

Is the tenant entitled to an order that the landlord cancel or withdraw the Notice?

Is the tenant entitled to an order granting more time to complete the Application for Dispute Resolution in this matter?

Conclusion

As the applicant did not attend to present their Application, I dismiss the tenant's application for a cancellation of the Notice, with leave to reapply. While I have provided leave to re-apply, it does not extend any applicable time limits under the *Act* and I have made no legal findings on the merits of the dispute.
