DECISION

Introduction

The tenants applied to the Residential Tenancy Branch [the 'RTB'] for Dispute Resolution. The tenants ask me to cancel a 10-day Notice to End Tenancy for Unpaid Rent [the 'Notice'].

The landlords appeared at the hearing on 5 May 2023. The tenants also appeared.

Settlement of Dispute

During this hearing, the parties settled their dispute. In settling this dispute, they agreed on the following terms [the 'Terms'].

- 1. The Notice is cancelled.
- 2. The tenants shall pay to the landlords \$6,500.00 before 1 May 2025 [the 'Debt'].
- 3. The tenants shall pay the Debt in monthly instalments of at least \$270.00, and the landlords agree to provide the tenants with a receipt for each such instalment payment.
- 4. This settlement comprises the full and final settlement of the tenants' application.

At the hearing, both parties confirmed that they understood and agreed to these Terms and that:

• the Terms are final, binding and enforceable; and

 \cdot the Terms settle all aspects of this dispute.

Conclusion

In light of this settlement, I order that the tenants pay \$6,500.00 to the landlords. This gives effect to the settlement reached between the parties, as discussed at the hearing. To enforce this order, the landlords must serve the tenants with a copy of it. If the landlords need to enforce this order, then they can file this order in the Small Claims Division of the Provincial Court of British Columbia.

I make this decision per section 63 of the *Residential Tenancy Act* [the 'Act'], and on authority delegated to me by the Director of the RTB per section 9.1(1) of the Act.
